## Bills Obama Has Introduced in the Senate

WIKIPEDIA DEFINITIONS:

A **bill** is a proposed new law introduced within a [legislature](#) that has not been [ratified](#), adopted, or received [assent](#). Once a bill has become law, it is thereafter an [act](#); but in popular usage (or even in moments of scholarly imprecision) the two terms are often treated interchangeably. Bills have a [sponsor](#) and sometimes cosponsors.

A **sponsor**, in the [United States Congress](#), is a [senator](#) or [representative](#) who **introduces** a [bill](#) or [amendment](#) and is its **chief advocate**.

In contrast to a sponsor, a "**cosponsor**" is a senator or representative who adds his or her name as a **supporter** to the sponsor's bill.

To require Federal agencies to support health impact assessments and take other actions to improve health and the environmental quality of communities, and for other purposes.
